Introduction

Arid and semi arid regions are suffering from several water issues such as desertification, water scarcity, and upstream countries commitment to downstream countries in water share, significant effect of climate change. The conference aims at strengthening the cooperation between the Islamic states in order to enhance the social and environmental aspect. Main fields of concern of the conference are capacity building and transfer of knowledge and technology among the Islamic states in providing clean potable water, sewage services, irrigation systems, food security, and disaster prevention.

In 2015, the OIC Water Vision was issued under the title "Working together for a water secure future". The conference will concentrate on implementation plan of this Water Vision.

Opportunity to explore Egypt's experience in these fields will be available through alternative field trips to selected projects.
